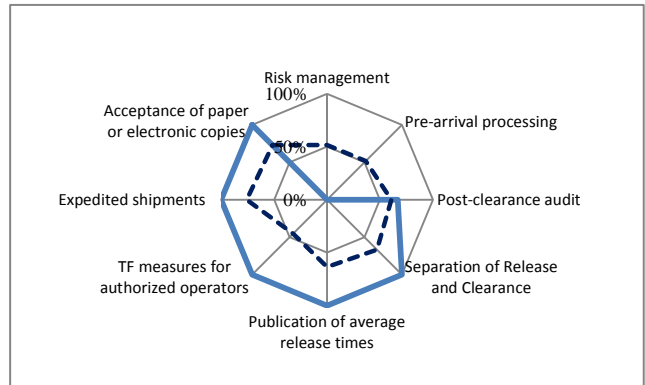

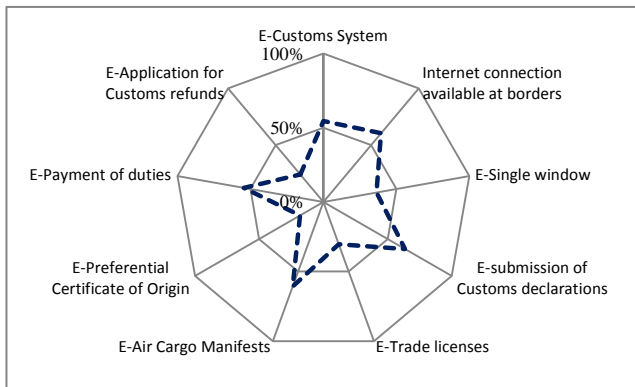

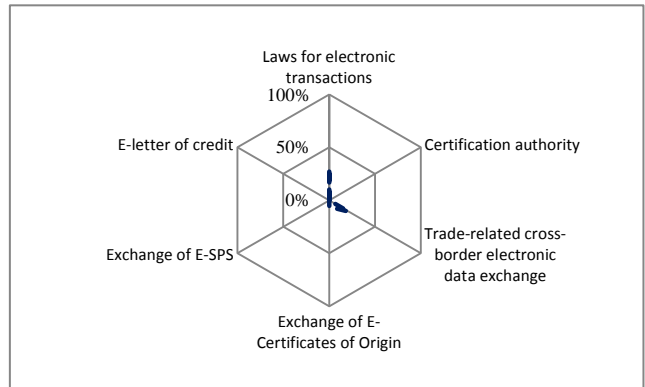

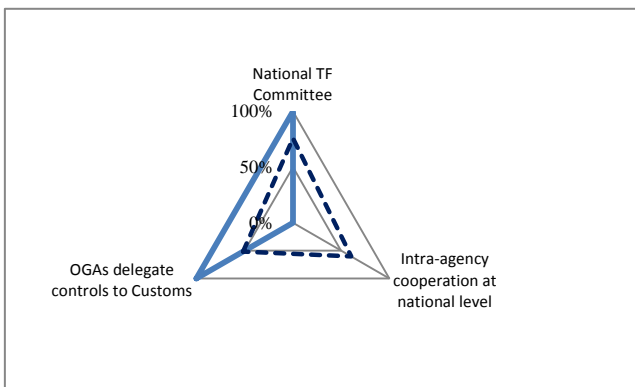

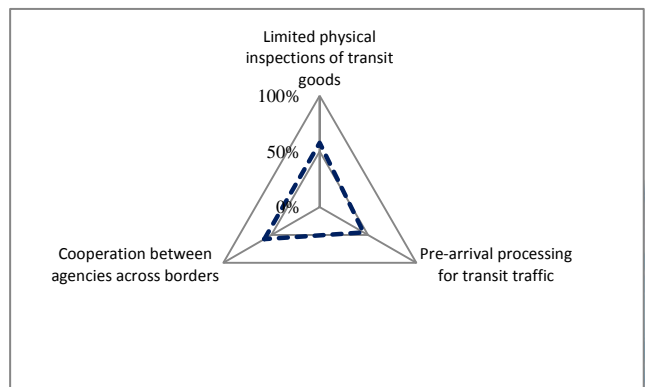

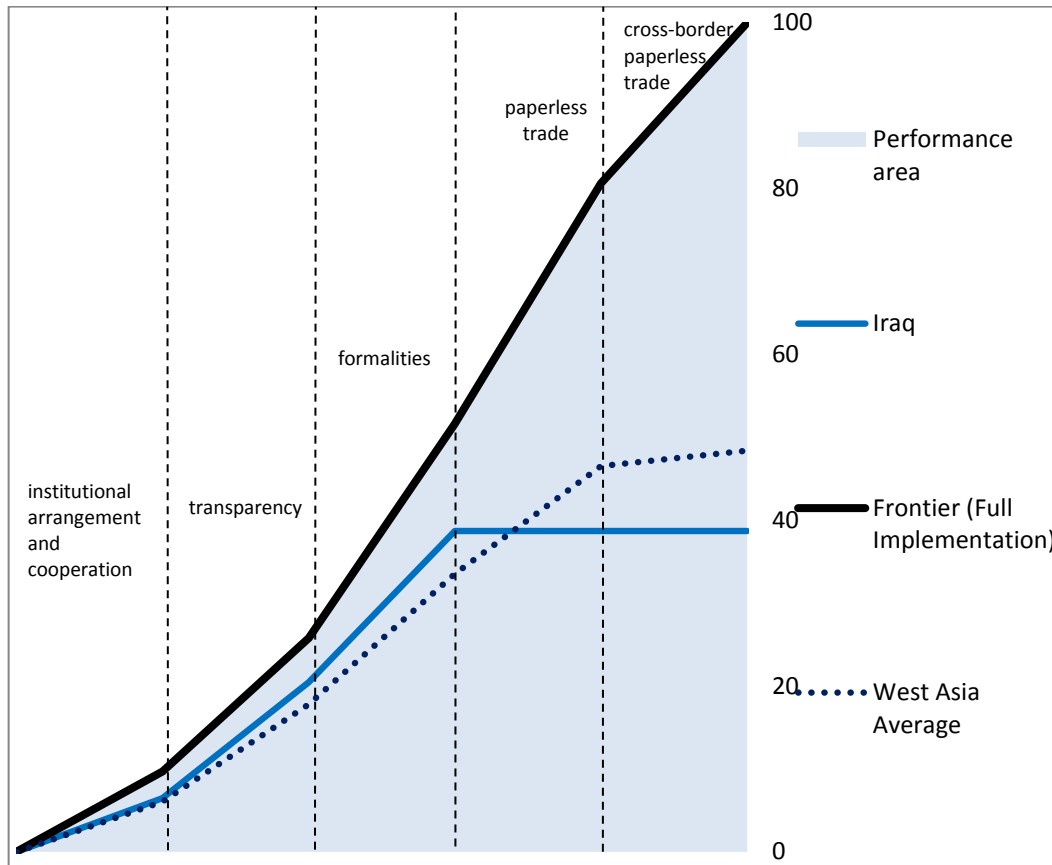

Moving up the trade facilitation ladder towards seamless international supply chains

The level of implementation of trade facilitation measures in Iraq (38.7%) is below the level in West Asia (48.4%). The most implemented trade facilitation measures in Iraq are “Transparency” measures (86.7%). The least implemented are “Paperless trade”, “cross-border paperless trade” and (0.0%). “Transit” measures have not been implemented.

Implementation of “Formalities” measures is above the regional average. However, measures such as *Risk management*, *Pre-arrival processing* and *Post-clearance audit* have not been implemented in Iraq. Other “Formalities” measures have been fully implemented.

In “Institutional arrangement and cooperation”, Iraq’s implementation exceeds the regional average by 4%. However, *Intra-agency cooperation at national level* has not been implemented yet.

Iraq may focus its trade facilitation efforts in particular on gradual implementation of “Transit” and “Paperless trade” measures, as well as on moving towards “Cross-border paperless trade”.
